

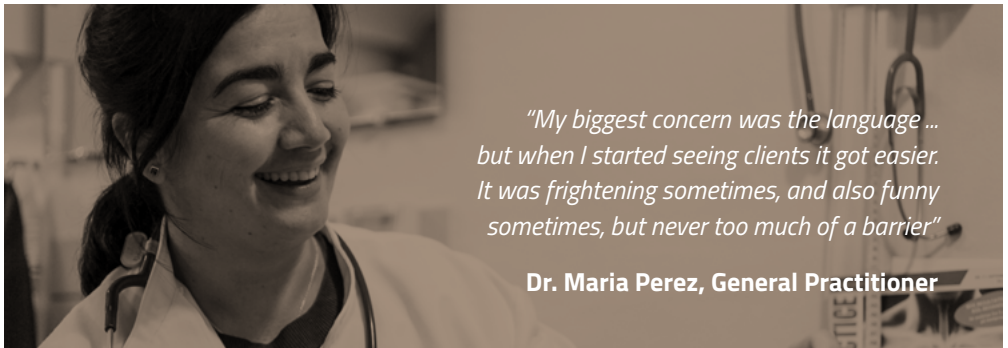

INTERESTED? – WHAT TO DO

Upload your CV at our website www.workindenmark.dk. It is important that you describe the following points in detail:

- Your medical education and postgraduate training (where, when, title)
- Your clinical work experience (where, when, what)
- Your professional skills and competences (clinical skills, techniques used, numbers etc.)
- A brief overview of your research activities.
- A personal profile with a short description of your special interests and future plans for clinical work.

Before you start uploading your CV, we recommend that you visit our e-learning module on how to write a CV according to Danish standards.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

If your skills and competences match the hospitals' needs, we will send your CV to relevant hospitals. The hospitals will then evaluate your professional competences. Before we send your CV to the hospital, we will contact you by email for approval.

In case a hospital is interested in your profile, you will be contacted directly for further discussions about the job offer, in most cases via Skype, and later via a visit at the hospital.

If both parties are still interested after the visit, the hospital will sign an employment contract with you. Throughout the entire recruitment process you will be assisted by the hospital staff.

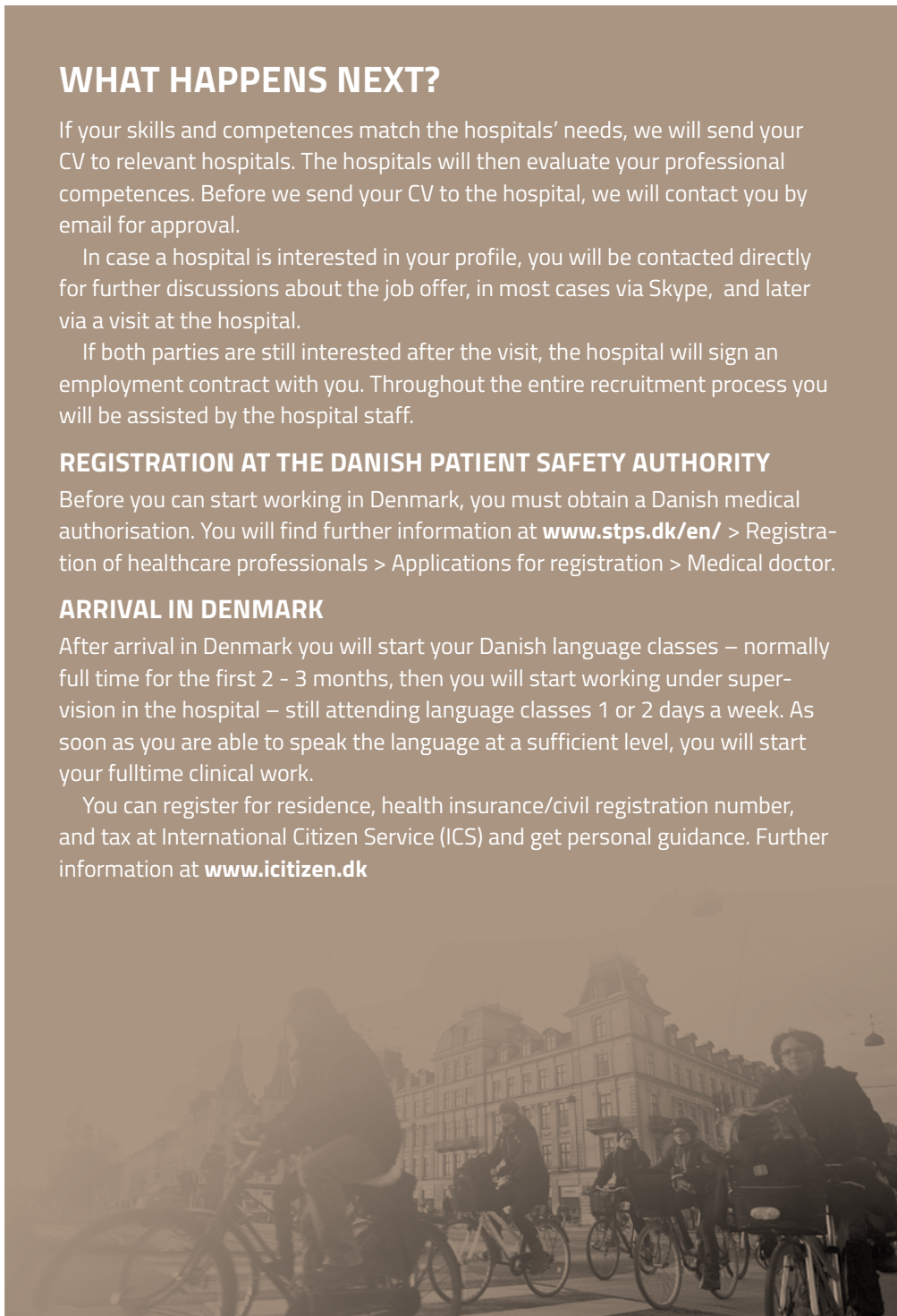
REGISTRATION AT THE DANISH PATIENT SAFETY AUTHORITY

Before you can start working in Denmark, you must obtain a Danish medical authorisation. You will find further information at www.stps.dk/en/ > Registration of healthcare professionals > Applications for registration > Medical doctor.

ARRIVAL IN DENMARK

After arrival in Denmark you will start your Danish language classes – normally full time for the first 2 - 3 months, then you will start working under supervision in the hospital – still attending language classes 1 or 2 days a week. As soon as you are able to speak the language at a sufficient level, you will start your fulltime clinical work.

You can register for residence, health insurance/civil registration number, and tax at International Citizen Service (ICS) and get personal guidance. Further information at www.icitizen.dk
